



A hundred talented young international composers aspire to winning the 2024 Gil Soundtrack Awards contest.

This is the fifth time this internationally-recognised prize, promoted by Viñas Familia Gil, is being awarded, with the participation of up to a hundred hitherto-unreleased compositions.

Each participant has submitted a soundtrack for the short film “OFF-WINE. Intelligence can be artificial, but the terroir cannot”. And from all of them, the winner of the prize promoted by the Viñas Familia Gil group of wineries will be chosen. The prize consists of €50,000, and is the largest in the world for young composers.

The tremendously-varied and creative submissions come from different continents, bringing together contenders of up to 29 different nationalities, from Australia to Canada, with the highest number represented by talented Spaniards. Thus, with this year's biennial competition, more than 600 people have participated over the five times the contest has been held.

The original short film “OFF WINE. Intelligence can be artificial, but the terroir cannot” by Gerard Vidal is the canvas on which the OSTs have been composed.

The short film depicts a dystopian grape harvest, very different to those we are familiar with. In it, two grape-pickers clash: an ultra-technological woman who avoids all human relations. And a man who has no notion whatsoever of technology. The pair are forced to co-exist in a fully-robotised environment.

The short film, which features Ivana Baquero, winner of a Goya Award for best newcomer actress, and is directed by Gerard Vidal, was filmed in different locations, most notably Jumilla, an extremely important region for Familia Gil.

Produced by ESCAC, where the director had already won a screenplay contest, the short film was created entirely by students and graduates of the centre, and entailed an innovative post-production effort, utilising AI and 3D resources.

A jury of stars, talented names from film and national and international composers

The jury of this fifth Gil Soundtrack Award is chaired by **Esther García**, production manager of El Deseo, winner of the National Cinematography Prize and one of the foremost women in the Spanish cinema industry, as well as a figure who is highly committed to equality in our country's film industry.

The **winner of 3 Goya Awards** as Production Manager, she has produced more than 90 films and multiple projects alongside Pedro Almodóvar, Guillermo del Toro and Mónica Laguna, among many more.



The jury will select the piece which symbolises the relationship that connects music to film. A link that generates indelible impacts on spectators, without which the full spectrum of emotions could not be conveyed.

Talented young people always manage to break new boundaries and advance necessary steps in an industry like entertainment. The objective of this prize is to further the professional career of these promising young people, so that they can share their audacity, personality and unique experiences with us.

As it happens, after winning this contest four careers received the boost needed for the winners to be able to devote themselves solely and exclusively to music.

After the presentation of all the contenders, the Gil Soundtrack Award is increasingly close to announcing the winner.

With the participation phase now over, all that remains is to wait for the jury to deliberate and announce first the 6 finalists, and then the official winner.

On 9 September, the selection of the six best compositions for the short film in the jury's opinion will be made public, in line with the criterion of rigour in terms of creativity, cohesion and innovation. The six selected works will include the winner of the 2024 Gil Soundtrack Award and the official soundtrack of the short film "OFF-WINE. Intelligence can be artificial, but the terroir cannot".
